PHTM is pleased to be part of the Auckland Festival of Photography, We are in the 'Fringe/South' section.

733 children and 102 adults came to the Polish children's camp in Pahiatua.

New Zealanders gave an extraordinary welcome to these 'first refugees' as they were transported by train on 1st November 1944 from Wellington to Pahiatua. A place they named 'Little Poland'.

This was to become their first home in New Zealand.

This year marks the 70th anniversary of the arrival of the 'Children of Pahiatua'.

The June 'Sunday Winter Films' runs in conjunction with the exhibition.

8th June Collection of short films

40min., relating to the children of Pahiatua, as part of the photographic exhibition in the Lower Gallery PHTM called 'Little Poland in Pahiatua' in the fringe section of the 'Auckland Photography Festival'

15 June Poles Apart, 60 min. The story of 733 Polish orphans who came to New Zealand in 1944. With a backdrop provided by the events of World War Two, the documentary traces their long and arduous journey from Poland through Siberia, Uzbekistan and Persia to N Z: a journey that takes them from the warmth and comfort of their homes in Poland, to the freezing barracks of Siberian forced labour camps, to the suffocating heat of the mud huts of Uzbekistan, to converted harems and stables of the Shah of Persia and finally to a former POW camp in Pahiatua.

22nd June Katyn, 117 min. film about 1940 Katyn massacre directed by Andrzej Wajda. It was nominated for the Best Foreign Language Film for the 80th Academy Awards. In the movie the events of Katyn are related through the eyes of the women, the mother, wives and daughters of the victims executed on Stalin's order by the NKVD in 1940.

28th June Warsaw Uprising 44, 50min, the story of the Uprising presented from the perspective of participants, mainly insurgents who in a lively, involved and emotional way talk about their experiences, fate of their friends and their beloved city. The story is also told from 2 other perspectives, a German soldier, who participated in the brutal suppression of the Warsaw's quarter Wola and a British pilot and member of the British Military Mission in Moscow. Their accounts allow their views to reconstruct a dramatic story of the uprising and the personal dramas of its participants.
